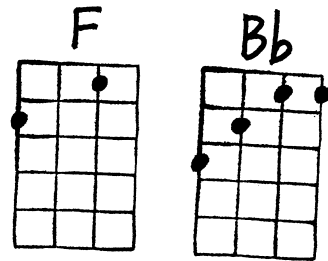


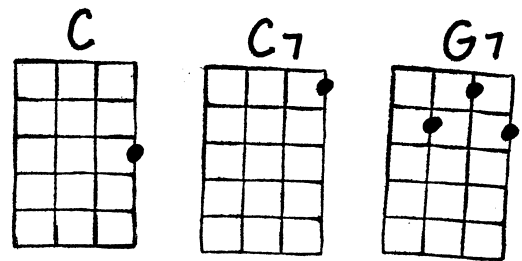

 All the world seems bright and gay.



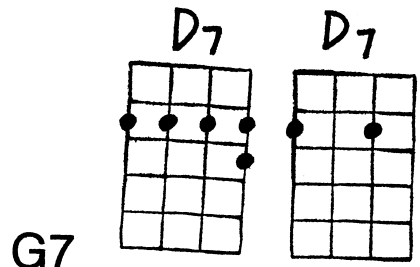
Bb C7 F
